

Career and Technical Education Opportunities

Any student that expressed interest in a program, attended this informational session and had the chance to ask Ana questions.



Scheduling

East Senior School Counselors will begin to start the scheduling process with your child beginning in February. The process will begin with a presentation in the classroom for the students and they will have an opportunity to input their course requests. The portal for this process will continue to stay open for a couple of days so families can review the options and make any changes necessary. The final step will be an individual meeting with their counselor to review their requests, discuss graduation requirements, and future plans.

Congratulations on an incredible career! Mrs.
Gugino began her teaching career 32 years ago in the Clarence School District. She came to West Seneca in 1990 and then spent the 1991-92 school year in Niagara Wheatfield after being "excessed".
Luckily, a position became available in West Seneca the following year and she returned to service in West Seneca in the fall of 1992. During her tenure, she has taught a wide variety of courses including Regents and General Earth Science, Regents and General Biology, AP Biology, 8th Grade Science and Anatomy and Physiology. Her most recent assignment, in the AIS setting, requires helping students in a variety of subjects. An outstanding role model, she epitomizes the ideology of "a life"



long learner" when she re-learned Algebra so she could help the students!

Mentor, friend, educator and inspiration are all terms that describe Mrs. Gugino. During her career, she's been recognized as Teacher of the Year by both students and her union colleagues. In 2012, she was recognized as a Teacher of Merit by Business First (only 25 local teachers received this designation). She's one of the hardest working individuals I've ever met. She's highly professional, creative and organized. Sometimes, I think she gets more done by accident than some people do on purpose!

But, Mrs. Gugino believes her most important achievements are the priceless bonds she's formed with students and colleagues. She's been a Science Honor Society Advisor and a Senior Class Advisor. She helped to orchestrate the first Senior Class trip to Disney World! As Science Club Advisor she's taken countless groups of students (and colleague chaperones!) camping in Allegany State Park, horseback riding, hiking several local sites, including the Niagara Gorge. There have been special trips to Costa Rica, Disney World and snorkeling in Florida. She's taken hundreds of students on zoo trips and always remembers to bring back an East favorite - "Nickel City Reptiles" with East alum Jeff Musial - for an annual presentation. She and Mrs. Smilinich have tirelessly organized college visit trips for students struggling to find a school with the "right fit". Her enthusiasm and sheer love of science have inspired many of her students and club members to pursue science and teaching careers. She maintains communication with many students she mentored years ago who are

now successfully practicing physicians, nurses, therapists, physician assistants and teachers. Both of her daughters work in science based careers!



Students who successfully complete the AOBF requirements receive a Regents Diploma with Technical Endorsement and a certificate of Financial Studies issued by the National Academy Foundation. Students will learn transferable business skills and knowledge with a focus on the business industry. AOBF members will create an Employability Portfolio and participate in industry sponsored activities including field trips, shadow days, classroom speakers, paid internships, and may earn college credit for courses.

ACADEMY OF IT/DIGITAL MEDIA (AOIT/DM)

A National Academy Foundation Program

The Academy of IT/Digital Media connects students with the world of Information Technology and Digital Media. The curriculum covers an Introduction to IT, Web Page Design, Programming, Digital Media, App Development, Gaming, and other topics. Students who successfully complete the AOIT/DM requirements receive a Regents Diploma with Technical Endorsement and a certificate of IT/Digital Media Studies issued by the National Academy Foundation. Students will learn transferable skills and knowledge with a focus on the Information Technology and Digital Media industries. AOIT/DM members will create an Employability Portfolio and participate in industry sponsored activities including field trips, shadow days, classroom speakers, paid internships, and may earn college credit for courses.

ACADEMY OF LIFE SCIENCE (AOLS)

The Academy of Life Science prepares students to enter college and/or employment in the field of Life Science- a globally and locally expanding career field, which integrates science and technology to produce products and services that improve health and well-being. The curriculum covers Medical Terminology, Medical Ethics, Anatomy and Physiology, Bio-Tech Engineering, Physics, and other topics. Students will learn transferable skills and knowledge with a focus on the Life Science industry. AOLS members will create an Employability Portfolio and participate in industry sponsored activities including field trips, shadow days, classroom speakers, internships, and may earn college credit for courses.

ACADEMY OF VISUAL ARTS (AVA)

The Academy of Visual Arts is an enrichment program for students who demonstrate extraordinary ability and interest in the visual arts. The goal of the program is to provide students with a more mature understanding of visual concepts, enhance cultural awareness as well as develop the students' artistic abilities at a more sophisticated level. Students will have the opportunity to explore more challenging studio endeavors, participate in gallery and college visitations, be exposed to visiting artists as well as receive college credit upon successful completion of the Advanced Placement portfolio. Students enrolled in Studio in Art may apply into this enrichment program during their freshmen year. To complete the application process, interested students will be asked to produce a comprehensive portfolio of works created in Studio in Art and write an artist statement based on the outline provided.

ENGINEERING ACADEMY (EA)

The Engineering Academy curriculum explores principles of engineering, and provides content in the fields of Materials Processing, Civil Engineering/Architecture, Engineering Robotics, Engineering Design and Development, and other topics. Students wishing to participate in the Engineering Academy should take Design and Drawing for Production (DDP) during their freshman year. Students will learn transferable skills and knowledge with a focus on the Engineering industries. EA members will participate in industry sponsored activities including field trips, shadow days, classroom speakers, and may earn college credit for courses.
