Native Americans could claim their land was taken over by immigrants from Europe

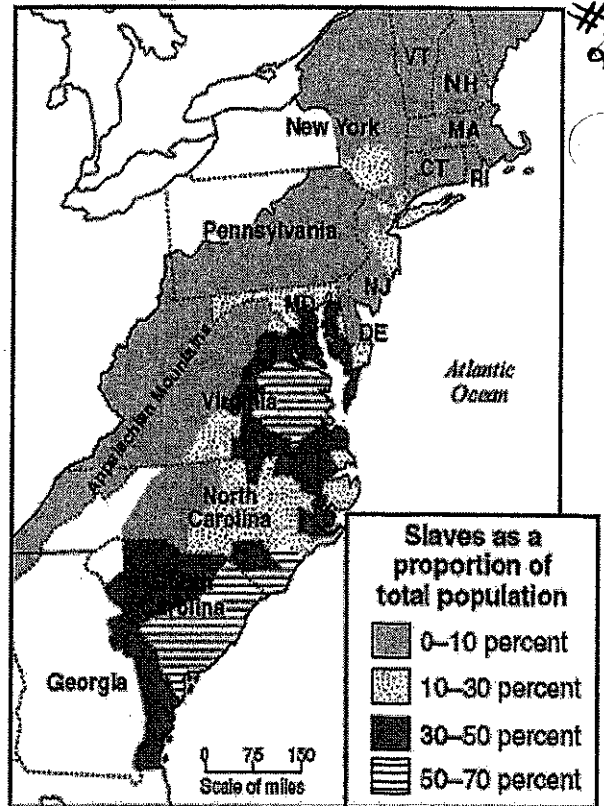
Based on image 2, where were most slaves located? WHY do you think this is the case?

Based on images 1 & 2, what conflicts occurred between Native Americans, Europeans and Africans in the colonies?

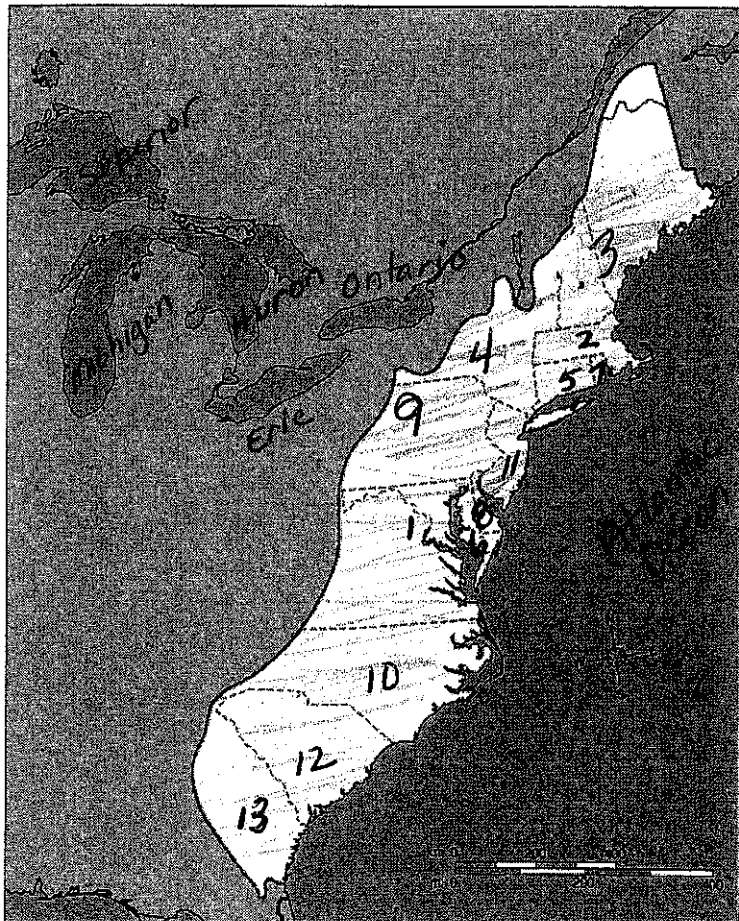
