DIRECTIONS: Based on the novel you read, you will complete 2 assignments that will count as a grade for the first quarter. Choose one from each category below:

Category #1: Answer **ONE** of the following questions based on your book. Be sure to write your answers using complete sentences and specific examples/detail/quotes from the book.

Finally, be sure to answer ALL parts of each question.

1. Describe the ***setting*** of your novel. Where and when does the overall story take place? Is the setting extremely important to your book? Why or why not?

2. Give a **characterization** of your main character. Make sure to identify who your main character is, and list and explain at least two traits for this character. (If you have two or more main characters, you may choose any two and discuss one character trait for each.)
3. Describe the **major conflict** in your book and how it is resolved. How does your main character change or grow in some way by the end of your book? Explain.
4. What is the genre of your novel? Explain why your book fits in this genre.

Category #2: Choose any **ONE** of the following questions to answer. Remember to use complete sentences and specific examples from the book, and to answer **ALL** parts of the question.

1. What was the best part of this book? Explain with details. What was the worst part of this book? Explain using specific details.
2. If you could have a conversation with one character from the novel who would it be? Why? What would you discuss with him or her? Explain.
3. Give three reasons why this book should be taught to the whole class. What can students learn from reading it?
4. Illustrate a book cover different from the one on your book. Write a short paragraph explaining your design.
