<u>DIRECTIONS</u>: Based on the novel you read, you will complete a total of **FOUR short paragraph** responses (around 4-5 sentences each) that will count as a grade for the first quarter.

<u>Category 1:</u> Choose <u>TWO</u> of the following questions to answer based on your book. Be sure to write each answer using <u>complete sentences</u>, <u>specific examples/details/quotes from the book</u>, and remember to <u>answer ALL parts of each question</u>.

- 1. Describe the **setting** of your novel. Where and when does the overall story take place? Is the setting extremely important to your book? Why or why not? Explain.
- 2. Give a **characterization** (description of the personality) of your main character. Make sure to identify who your main character is, and list and explain <u>at least two traits</u> for this character. (If you have two or more main characters, you may choose any two and discuss one character trait for each.)
- 3. What are some of the **main conflicts** (problems/issues) that the main character(s) faces? How does he/she/they attempt to deal with these issues? Explain.

<u>Category 2:</u> Choose <u>ONE</u> of the following questions to answer. Remember to use complete sentences and specific examples from the book, and to answer <u>ALL</u> parts of the question.

- 4. Discuss the **resolution** (how the book draws to a close at the end) of your book. How does your main character change or grow in some way by the end of your book based on how the major conflict is resolved? Explain.
- 5. What is a possible **theme** for this novel? (*Remember, a theme is a universal message of a book, something you believe the author wants you to learn or think about). What details from the novel help to show this theme? Explain.
- 6. What is the **genre** of your novel? Explain why your book fits in this genre using specific details from the novel.

<u>Category 3:</u> Choose <u>ONE</u> of the following questions to answer. Remember to use complete sentences and specific examples from the book, and to answer <u>ALL</u> parts of the question.

- 7. What was the best part of this book? Explain with details. What was the worst part of this book? Explain using specific details.
- 8. If you could have a conversation with one character from the novel who would it be? Why? What would you discuss with him or her? Explain.
- 9. Illustrate a book cover design that is different from the original cover design. Write a short paragraph explaining your new design.
